Project Description

The Town of Pelham proposes a centralized Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and Emergency Operations Center to consolidate emergency response serving the Town of Pelham, the Village of Pelham, and the Village of Pelham Manor. This shared facility will improve intergovernmental coordination, reduce duplicative infrastructure, and increase operational efficiency.

The Center will include climate-controlled ambulance bays, paramedic quarters, kitchen and sanitary facilities, and a dedicated Emergency Operations Center (EOC) to support coordinated incident response and continuity of government. It will replace a temporary and decentralized space with a single, purpose-built facility designed for modern EMS operational and storage standards.

Centralizing vehicles, equipment, and operations will support proper medication and equipment management, reduce weather-related wear and tear, and provide a permanent base for emergency coordination and disaster response across all three municipalities and Westchester County. The Town seeks \$1,125,000 in Local Government Efficiency funding to support construction as part of a broader municipal capital investment.

Pelham EMS currently operates from a temporary structure that lacks compliant, climate-controlled ambulance bays, exposing critical equipment and supplies to weather, increasing vehicle wear, and creating operational inefficiencies due to non-co-location. In addition, none of the three Pelham municipalities has a permanent Emergency Operations Center (EOC), limiting coordinated incident management. The proposed consolidated EMS Station and hardened EOC will strengthen incident command, improve intermunicipal coordination, and enhance continuity of government, consistent with NYS Department of State Local Government Efficiency Program goals.

The proposed Emergency Medical Services and Emergency Operations Center in Pelham, NY aligns with the Mid-Hudson Regional Economic Development Council Strategic Plan by advancing investments in resilient public infrastructure, emergency preparedness, and efficient municipal service delivery. The project strengthens regional resiliency by providing a centralized, hardened facility to support emergency response, incident management, and continuity of government operations serving multiple municipalities. By consolidating EMS operations and shared emergency functions into a single, purpose-built facility, the project promotes intermunicipal cooperation, protects critical public assets, and enhances the reliability of essential services that support community stability and economic vitality across the region.

The project addresses operational and service delivery challenges caused by the absence of a permanent, compliant EMS facility. EMS vehicles are currently housed in a temporary structure that lacks climate control and co-location with operational support space, creating inefficiencies and increased wear on vehicles and equipment. The Town also lacks a dedicated Emergency Operations Center, limiting coordinated incident management. The project resolves these issues by providing a purpose-built facility that improves operational readiness, asset protection, and emergency coordination.

The Town of Pelham has taken formal steps demonstrating readiness to proceed with the project. In January 2025, the Town Board adopted a resolution authorizing advancement of the Emergency Medical Services and Emergency Operations Center project and pursuit of funding. In September 2025, the Town Board further documented its intent to acquire the proposed project site from Westchester County, establishing site identification and municipal commitment. These actions demonstrate local authorization, site readiness, and the Town's ability to proceed with implementation upon award.

The project impacts multiple municipal functions, including Emergency Medical Services operations, emergency management and incident command, and continuity of government coordination. While focused on emergency services, the facility supports cross-departmental coordination during emergencies involving public safety, municipal administration, and regional partners, increasing the overall complexity of the project.

Planning decisions for this project are grounded in documented operational experience, municipal policy direction, and regional emergency preparedness priorities. In recent years, the Town of Pelham transitioned emergency medical services in house, resulting in significant improvements in service quality and operational performance. In recognition of these achievements, the Town's emergency medical response services were named EMS Agency of the Year for 2024 by the Westchester County Regional EMS Council.

While the transition required use of a temporary EMS location, ongoing operations demonstrated the need for a permanent, purpose-built facility to sustain and support this award-winning service. In 2024, the Town formally identified the lack of compliant, climate-controlled ambulance bays and centralized operational space as a critical infrastructure gap. In January 2025, the Town Board adopted a resolution authorizing advancement of a centralized Emergency Medical Services and Emergency Operations Center and pursuit of funding. Subsequent Town Board actions in 2025 documented intent to acquire a suitable site from Westchester County. Relevant resolutions and meeting excerpts are provided as supporting documentation.

The Town of Pelham has formally considered this project through municipal policy actions and planning discussions focused on strengthening emergency services infrastructure. Following the transition to an in-house EMS operation and the use of a temporary facility, the Town identified the need for a permanent, purpose-built Emergency Medical Services and Emergency Operations Center to support ongoing operations.

In January 2025, the Town Board adopted a resolution authorizing advancement of the project and pursuit of funding. Subsequent Town Board actions in 2025 documented intent to acquire a suitable site from Westchester County. These actions demonstrate the Town's willingness and commitment to undertake the project and proceed with implementation upon securing funding. Relevant resolutions and meeting excerpts are provided as supporting documentation.

The facility will utilize existing road access and utilities, improving reliability and long-term service delivery.

Existing infrastructure cannot be feasibly reused or upgraded to meet the operational

needs of the Town's EMS and emergency management functions. EMS vehicles are currently housed in a temporary structure that lacks climate-controlled ambulance bays, compliant storage, and co-located operational space. In addition, there is no existing facility that can be adapted to function as a dedicated Emergency Operations Center. The proposed project addresses these limitations by constructing a purpose-built facility designed to meet modern EMS operational, safety, and emergency coordination requirements.

The project is located within an established municipal center adjacent to the U.S. Post Office, near Metro-North Railroad infrastructure, and with access from the Hutchinson River Parkway. The site is in a developed civic and transportation corridor surrounded by existing public infrastructure and services.

Centralizing services in a developed area reduces travel distances, complements transit access, and avoids increased automobile dependency associated with dispersed facilities.
